Regular Called Meeting streamed via Facebook Live
Minutes for March 1, 2021 7:00 ET

Due to the Covid-19 (Corona Virus) and orders from Governor Andy Beshear, the March 1, 2021 Regular Called Meeting was held at City Hall and streamed via Facebook Live.

The Regular Called Meeting of the Irvington City Council was called to order by Mayor Yvonne Kennedy. Prayer was by Council Member Bruce Basham followed by the Pledge to the American Flag.

Council Members Bruce Basham, Pat Logsdon, Charles Douglas Lucas, Ricky Lucas, Ronnie Robinson, Robert Young III and City Attorney Rachel Brown were all present.

Bruce Basham moved to accept the minutes of the February 1, 2021 Regular Meeting Via Face Book Live. Motion was seconded by Ronnie Robinson. All council members voted affirmative. Motion carried.

Pat Logsdon moved to accept the minutes of the February 22, 2021 Special Called Meeting via Face Book Live. Motion was seconded by Charles Douglas Lucas. All council members voted affirmative. Motion carried.

City Clerk Mona Drane was absent. Assistant City Clerk Kristie Taul was present to take minutes. The Treasurer's Report and the Clerk's Report were provided in the packets. Total City Stickers sold in February – 215, Business License sold – 23, RECC collections - \$39,670.74, Overtime hours 104:59. Mayor Kennedy reported she had two appointments with the auditor that had been postponed due to inclement weather. She will contact Melissa Martin about the audit.

Supervisor Chris Lucas reported the public works department cleaned up around the burn pile, done some snow removal, hauled rock for stock pile at shop, continued looking for a leak, had one leak at Woodlawn Trailer Park, had sewer problems on Ashby Street and Michelle Way, thawed two water meters, cleaned up around shop and recycle property and picked up trash on right of way. Chris Lucas reported some sidewalks have been poured. The contractor is currently doing dirt work.

Mayor Kennedy reported Ray's Electric will repair the lighting in the cross at the Cedar Hill Cemetery this week.

Police Chief Brandon Brinkley along with two other officers were at a training. No report was made.

Fire Chief Brian Board was absent. No report was made. There was some discussion on the reimbursement program, no action taken.

Ronnie Robinson suggested getting flags donated to Veteran's Memorial. Mayor Kennedy will seek donations.

Mayor Kennedy reported the Ballfield Grant at Vance Simmons Park has been extended. Ray's Electric is to make repairs at the Eva Carman Park on Wednesday, March 3, 2021. Council members suggested looking into a skate park or water park. Mona Drane is researching grants for disk golf courses at both parks.

The Code Enforcement Board did not meet in February due to inclement weather. The next meeting will be March 17, 2021 at 6:00 pm ET at City Hall. Mayor Kennedy will check with the State Road on putting up a “no parking here to corner” sign on First Street.

Old Business – The second reading of Ordinance 2019-04-04 An Ordinance Adopting the Fourth Amended Annual Budget for Fiscal Year July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 was read by Mayor Yvonne Kennedy. Pat Logsdon moved to accept the second reading and the motion was seconded by Robert Young III. Council Members Bruce Basham, Pat Logsdon, Charles D Lucas, Ronnie Robinson and Robert Young III voted “aye” and Council Member Ricky Lucas voted “nay”. Motion carried.

The second reading of Ordinance 2020-8.1 An Ordinance Adopting the First Amended Annual Budget for Fiscal Year July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021 was read by Mayor Yvonne Kennedy. Pat Logsdon moved to accept the second reading and the motion was seconded by Robert Young III. Council Members Bruce Basham, Pat Logsdon and Robert Young III voted “aye”. Council Members Charles D Lucas, Ricky Lucas and Ronnie Robinson voted “nay”. Mayor Yvonne Kennedy cast an “aye” vote to break the tie. Motion carried.

The sanitation bid was tabled until the April meeting. It was requested Santek add the wording to pick up bulk items to their bid.

There were some questions regarding the needed zoning change at the old Irvington Elementary School site. City Attorney Rachel Brown and Mona Drane will be working on this matter.

New Business – Resolution 2021-1 concerning FY2020 Motor Fuel Tax revenue and street repair was read by Mayor Yvonne Kennedy.

Food truck vendors have shown interest in coming to Irvington. An ordinance concerning some regulation may need to be adopted. City Attorney Rachel Brown had some questions and will contact Mona Drane on this.

Bruce Basham moved to adjourn the meeting. Motion was seconded by Charles D Lucas. All members voted affirmative. Motion carried.
